Dublin: Dublin is the capital of the Republic of Ireland and is Ireland's largest city. With its natural and historical treasures it's the 3rd most visited city in Europe with over 4 million visitors per year. In 2003, Dublin was chosen the most habitable city in Europe and the Ireland was chosen the happiest country in Europe. People visiting Dublin quickly realizes the reasons for these accomplishments. Trinity College, Dublin National Museum, St. Stephen's Park, Temple Bar Streets and Dublin Castle are one of the few fantastic locations you can visit in Dublin. Dublin has a warm climate with just over a million population living in the city. Country's safe environment, people's positive approach towards Turks and the welcoming and warm citizens are some of the few additional good features worth mentioning.

Viking Splash Tours: Viking Splash Tours Dublin have been entertaining and educating adults and kids alike, native and foreign for the last ten years with their unique fun tour of Dublin. You will be taken around Dublin, not on a bus but on an amphibious vehicle called a Dukw. Yes a Dukw – which is an authentic World War Two American land to sea vehicle which was built by the General Motor Corporation. These Dukws played a huge role in landing Allied Troops on the Beaches of Normandy during the Day Landings. Originally there were approximately 22,000 of these work horse vehicles in service with the American forces, but only a few hundred have survived till today. And you and your family could take a trip on one. Living history before you ever see Dublin at all.



Wax Museum: The National Wax Museum is a privately owned waxworks museum in Dublin, Ireland. On 7 October, 2009. Visitors to the museum are taken on a journey through Irish history, an enchanting Kids zone of discovery, Ireland's only dedicated tribute to our top scientific inventors, a Green screen video room, a recording studio and all the exceptional life-like wax work characters you can expect at the national museum. These interactive activities are popular with families, kids and adults alike. The National Wax Museum Plus offers a museum experience unlike any other. Why not come see for yourself!

Trinity College Dublin: Trinity College, formally known as the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity of Queen Elizabeth near Dublin, is the sole constituent college of the University of Dublin in Ireland. The college was founded in 1592 as the "mother" of a new university. It is one of the seven ancient universities of Britain and Ireland as well as Ireland's oldest university. The Library of Trinity College is the largest research library in Ireland. The Library contains about five million books, including 30,000 current serials and significant collections of manuscripts, maps, and printed music. The Book of Kells is by far the Library's most famous book and is located in the Old Library, along with the Book of Durrow, the Book of Howth and other ancient texts.



Chester Beatty Library: The Chester Beatty Library was established in Dublin, Ireland in 1950, to house the collections of mining magnate, Sir Alfred Chester Beatty. The present library, on the grounds of Dublin Castle, opened on February 7, 2000, the 125th anniversary of Beatty's birth and was named European Museum of the Year in 2002. The Library's collections are displayed in two collections: "Sacred Traditions" and "Artistic Traditions". Both displays exhibit manuscripts, miniature paintings, prints, drawings, rare books and some decorative arts from the Islamic, East Asian and Western Collections. The Library is one of the premier sources for scholarship in both the Old and New Testaments and is home to one of the most significant collections of Islamic and Far Eastern artefacts.

Croke Park Stadium: Croke Park Stadium is Ireland's largest and most iconic sporting arena and is the 3rd largest stadium in Europe. It showcases Ireland's national games of hurling and Gaelic football. Join the stadium tour and immerse yourself in Ireland's sporting and cultural heritage. Croke Park is an iconic stadium, steeped in history, and has been at the heart of Irish sporting and cultural life for over 100 years.



Dublinia Museum: It is the most important museum to be seen in Dublin. This museum is in the heart of the city as it provides an opportunity to taste the harmony of modernism and history of Dublin. You will discover Vikings' clothes and some interesting decors in Dublinia Museum. Even though, you will have a great experience of wearing Vikings' clothes and taking Selfie.

Archeology and History Museum: You won't understand how time passes in this museum, which has historical structure, while you learn many things about Ireland. Clear explanations with a good perspective will help you to understand the history in a better way and avoid any confusions.



Butlers Chocolate Factory: Who could say 'no' for chocolate? That delicious factory was published in 1932 to produce Butlers chocolates that are very famous all over the world. Harp Concert: Harp is an ancient string instrument which is usually used in Classical Music of Western culture. Harp is usually played in orchestras and it is the only instrument which is played with fingers among other modern instruments. It is placed in upright position and played with fingers by pulling strings. Harp has 47 strings and 7 pedals. Harp is a significant instrument that represents Irish's characteristic future such as Irish music, lyrics, pride and independency.
