



## LONDON TRIP PACKAGE (3 nights)

**LONDON:** London is the capital city of England. London is a popular city for students because of its attractions, parks, museums, art galleries and leisure activities. Prime meridian line passes through Greenwich, which is very close to London. With a population of 8 million, it is the second most crowded city in European Union. There are more than 300 languages spoken in London. For that reason, London offers multicultural environment to socialise with other nationalities. London has very well established colleges and universities such as University College London (UCL), Imperial College London, and King's College London.

### Accommodation and Meal:

Double rooms will be provided at 3 stars hotel in London. Breakfast and dinner will be given through out the programme. Breakfast will be given as European breakfast at the hotel and Turkish traditional dinner will be offered outside.

### Travel:

**London Eye:** It is the tallest Ferris wheel in Europe. It is the most popular paid tourist attraction in the United Kingdom, visited by over 3.5 million people annually, and has made many appearances in popular culture. One revolution of London Eye takes about 30 minutes.



**Buckingham Palace:** Buckingham Palace has served as the official London residence of Britain's sovereigns since 1837. More than 50,000 people visit the Palace each year as guests to receptions, the Royal Garden Parties and many more occasions. Although in use for the many official events and receptions held by The Queen, the State Rooms at Buckingham Palace are open to visitors every year.



**Madame Tussauds:** Madame Tussauds is a major tourist attraction in London, displaying waxworks of historical and royal figures, film stars, and sports stars. Tussauds created her first wax figure, of Voltaire, in 1777. Madame Tussauds is owned now and operated by Merlin Entertainments.



**Oxford Street:** It is the biggest and the most popular shopping street in Europe. It is in the Borough of Westminster. About 548 shops are opened for their visitors. There are many gift shops available. You can buy your gifts from Oxford Street on the way back to Turkey.



**Big Ben:** It is a clock tower that is next to Westminster Palace. The tower holds the largest four-faced chiming clock in the world and is the third-tallest freestanding clock tower. The tower has become one of the most prominent symbols of both London and England and is often in the establishing shot of films set in the city.



**Palace of Westminster:** The Palace of Westminster is the meeting place of the House of Commons and the House of Lords, the two houses of the Parliament of the United Kingdom. Commonly known as the Houses of Parliament after its tenants, the Palace lies on the Middlesex bank of the River Thames in the City of Westminster, in central London.



**Trafalgar Square:** Trafalgar Square is a public space and tourist attraction in central London, built around the area formerly known as Charing Cross. It is situated in the City of Westminster. At its centre is Nelson's Column, which is guarded by four lion statues at its base. There are a number of commemorative statues and sculptures in the square, while one plinth, left empty since it was built in 1840, The Fourth Plinth, has been host to contemporary art since 1999. The square is also used for political demonstrations and community gatherings, such as the celebration of New Year's Eve.



**The River Thames:** The River Thames flows through southern England. It is the longest river entirely in England and the second longest in the United Kingdom, after the River Severn. While it is best known for flowing through London, the river also flows alongside other towns and cities, including Oxford, Reading, Henley-on-Thames, and Windsor.
